2010-11 WisLine Teleconference Series

September 13, 2010 (Monday), 10:30 a.m. – 12:20 p.m. – **DEVELOPING THE ANNUAL BUDGET** (#1777-1) – Learn the general statutory requirements and procedures that local governments are subject to in developing their annual budgets. The Village of Brown Deer's budget process and documents will be featured. *Russ Van Gompel, Village Manager of Brown Deer; and Kate Lawton of UWEX Local Government Center.*

November 16, 2010 (Tuesday), 10:30 a.m. – 12:20 p.m. (#1777-2) – **QUESTIONS ON THE SMOKING BAN?** – The statewide smoking ban became effective July 5, 2010 prohibiting smoking in enclosed places that are places of employment or public places. Learn what the responsibilities of local governments are in implementing and enforcing the law as well as the challenges and issues of implementation. *Curt Wytinski, League of Wisconsin Municipalities, and Lucy McGee, Assistant City Attorney for Eau Claire.*

December 14, 2010 (Tuesday), 10:30 a.m. – 12:20 p.m. – **THE 2010 CENSUS AND REDISTRICTING** (#1777-3) – Equal representation requires that representatives are from similarly-populated districts. The 2010 census data will be available to local governments in the spring of 2011. What is a WisLine?
