The CPM Curriculum

The CPM Colleague Group operated through an 18-month program (2 days per month) and forms a learning community between public sector professionals who are engaging with an intensive curriculum to hone management skills.

CPM classes are designed specifically for managers in local, tribal, state, and federal governments and nonprofit organizations. Classes are facilitated by faculty and staff with unique expertise in the public sector. Core classes address ethics, management assessment, leadership theory, communication skills, strategic planning, productivity and quality improvement, problem solving, and the public management progession. In-depth classes develop skills in project management, budgeting, policy analysis, change management, and leading for equity and inclusion

The program's final phase includes case studies, a class project supporting a community organization, an individual applied project, and a leadership seminar
